This is of particular use to students at partner collages who are unable to attend the training sessions we put on for students in Worcester. • Attending and providing to a workshop looking at the redevelopment of the lecture theatre in Riverside. Plans are in place to redevelop the lecture hall in the Riverside. I took a group of 5 students to the presentation where the suggested a number of options for the space.
