8.0 <u>Idea sent to Council from Executive Committee</u>

- Is there different demographics of students who may want dedicated time slots (LGBTQ+, BAME, other marginalized groups)
- Ensuring that the timings of workout hours are inclusive (varied timeslots in days/weeks)

SP asked what the process is now, the group seems to agree that this idea should be more inclusive. Do we have the power to amend this idea?

THB explained that the council does not have that power but has 2 suggestions to the council on how we can approach the matter:

- 1. We fail the idea here at council today, the women's network resubmits the idea with relevant changes and when it hits 25 up votes it can be readdressed at Executive Committee.
- 2. Approve the idea today as 'Women's Workout Hour' then encourage LGBTQ+ Network to submit an idea which complements the already passed idea.

- Concerns that the NUS petition has mixed agendas, mentions students shouldn't have to pay tuition fees, with the current party in government this may not be as effective due to mixed messages.

After the council had discussed the tuition fee repayment campaign, the group agreed that students needed to be made aware of the campaign and that there is a petition that can be signed if they wish. Councillors actioned elected officers to promote.
