
- Support and promote a bystander session on microaggressions

- Work with Heads of Schools and Reps to ensure student consultation takes place regarding January examinations – Complete – I attended a meeting with the Deputy Vice Chancellor, Head of Schools, Director of Quality and Educational Development and Academic Registrar to discuss the January exams and agree a student consultation plan
- Organise a meeting with the new university academic integrity lead to discuss plans for the year Complete I am in regular conversation with the AI lead and the working group. 
What are the 5 key tasks you aim to get done before the next meeting?

- Follow up with NUS and Robin Walker on the national healthcare meeting that took place to ensure that the experiences of Worcester students are being represented nationally.
- Complete the actions given to me by AROG and Education Council.
- Book a meeting with the TEL team to discuss Academic Representation sections on Blackboard for all Schools.
- Meet with the new senior members of staff at the University, including the Deputy Provost and Head of School for Education, to discuss how we can work together to support students.

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- I have continued to work on the national campaign promoting academic integrity while tackling academic misconduct and essay mills. We have set up an Academic Integrity collective with fellow VPEs and have agreed key aims moving forward. I also attended a meeting with Chris Skidmore who is taking a Ten Minute Bill tackling essay mills and contract cheating to the commons.
- We secured a Student Safety Net with the University which will support students, tackling academic disadvantage, while ensuring the hard work of students is recognised.
