Attendance

1. Welcome and Introductions

- JL welcomed all members to the final Student Activities Council of 2024-25 and introduced the agenda.
- Attendance and apologies are listed above.

Approval Items

2. Approval of Minutes of Previous Meeting

- With quoracy not met, the Student Activities Council Meeting minutes from 11th February 2025 could not be voted on for approval.
 - Post-meeting, an online vote was conducted via MS Forms (voting window from 1st April 10am to 8th April 9am) with 23/74 (31.1%) votes required to reach online vote quoracy.
 - At the deadline, 15 votes had been received, so the online voting window deadline was extended to 15th April 9am.
 - At the extended deadline, 24 votes had been received via the online vote:
 - For: 23
 - Against: 0
 - Abstain: 1
- Student Activities Committee Meeting minutes from 11th February 2025 were approved by majority via online vote.

5. Catering Feedback

- JL facilitated the gathering of feedback on the catering offer across the University campuses via flipchart paper.
- Summary of responses:
 - o General Feedback
 - Reduce the campus shop prices!
 - Kettles (if canteen staff aren't working, you have to pay £1.30 for hot water)
 - Keep vending machines stocked!



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- Vegan alternative to milk, which is easily available/grabbable in the canteen
- Canteen moved coffee machine behind the till, which causes long lines
- Bake & Bite is good
- o Ideas Shared
 - Hot water machine
 - Water dispenser on Pierson top floor
 - Summer BBQ's
 - Sandwich meal deal in canteen not just baguettes
- o St John's Campus
 - Elgar Kitchen should be open for longer. At the moment it closest too early to grab even an early dinner after lectures.
- o City Campus
 - There is no kitchen so there is no proper plate meals i.e. rice with beef and fries. There is a very short and repetitive food choice, such as jacket potato with anything on top every day. Please, they need to get proper meals to city campus.
 - P.S. Please ask the staff to leave napkins outside when they close thank you.
- o Jenny Lind
 - There is only a vending machine and moving to city everyday to get a jacket potato every day is not the crush of anyone. Please bring some options to Jenny Lind too.
- o Across Campuses
 - Please re-encourage the Coffee Pass Stamps across campuses. So
 often missed out on stamps since the staff don't remind/offer new
 stamp cards to replace old ones.

6. TeamWorc Awards Process

- SS gathered feedback on the TeamWorc Awards nominations and voting processes via flipchart paper.

- Cons
 - Length of time stretched to two weeks would be better
 - Nominations submission process one role within the committee designated to fill out the form to make it cleaner Other committee members to feedback their thoughts to that person
 - How is sports team + person considered? Can we make it clear what they are nominated for? Is it to do with uni sport or outside? University athlete?
 - Submission should be open throughout the year- allow for nominations to come when things happen
 - Subjectivity
 - Limited recognition

 - Pros
 - Straight forward process
 - 10 days is enough time
 - Democratic
 - Transparent
 - Engagement
 - Cons
 - All students should vote
 - Bias
 - Limited info
- Student Group Choice Awards Feedback (should be chosen by student groups?)
 - Sports Club of the Year: 6 agree, 0 disagree
 - Society of the Year: 5 agree, 1 disagree
 - Network of the Year: 6 agree, 0 disagree
 - Charity Fundraising Group of the Year: 3 agree, 2 disagree, 1 unsure
 - Event of the Year: 5 agree, 1 disagree
 - Student Group Choice Awards Feedback (comments)
 - Course Rep of the Year: should be chosen by student groups because they represent the students, they then know if they made contact and meaningful difference
- Time of Year: Nominations (mid-March)
 - Too Early?
 - Little bit early as some still competing
 - Should it be around Varsity? Lots of people do things in the run up to this
 - Agree! Plus, there's still events to come after nomination that possibly miss out on being considered for them.
 - Maybe after Varsity?
 - A little bit early, it has incomplete data since there will be more activities running



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- Just Right?
 - Any later would run into assignment season
 - Fair timing, just if events occur after nominations, you take last season's performance into consideration
 - Avoids last minute rush
- Too Late?
 - Open all year
 - Stress with assignments
- Time of Year: when should the TeamWorc Awards evening be held?
 - Before Assessment Period?
 - Before, as it gives people a positive thing to look forward to before exams
 - Most people will be here as May tends to be the end of lectures and people might go home
 - Pros: boosts morale, high attendance
 - Cons: distraction, timing conflicts
 - During Assessment Period?
 - Pros: breaks from stress, immediate recognition
 - Cons: low attendance, increased stress
 - After Assessment Period?
 - Would be better to enjoy everything when we are relaxed after exams and assignments
 - ^ disagree as most people will be at home
 - Right after assessment period so most (active) students are still here, and it is a nice way to close off the year. Before/during assessment period most students are busy and stressed, especially third years, so they might miss out entirely in favour of assignments / harbour guilt for attending when should be
 - doing the assignments
 - Doesn't get in the way of exams and exam prep, voting needs to take place before though
 - After might be the most beneficial to allow students to fully enjoy the event without the pressure of upcoming assessments and can serve as a celebratory conclusion
 - Pros: relaxed atmosphere, high attendance, celebratory mood
 - Cons: delayed recognition, post-assessment plans

 - Yes




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- Not enough?

- BB sought clarity or additional information from attendees regarding some feedback submissions:

10. TeamWorc Points

- JL reminded of the TeamWorc Points accreditation scheme and the associated Gold, Silver & Bronze targets.
- JL shared the current TeamWorc Points leaderboards.
 - Sports Clubs are led by Dance (485 points) who are the first Student Group to reach Gold status, followed by Cheerleading (300 points) who have now reached Silver, and Men's Cricket (245 points) who have furthered their bronze tally.
 - Aerial Fitness (210 points), Women's Cricket (175 points), and Social Sports (145 points) have all recently achieved Bronze accreditation
 - Societies are led by Paramedics (280 points) who have leapfrogged Gaming (265 points); both recently reaching Silver accreditation
 - MedSoc (195 points), Business (195 points), British Sign Language (160 points), Christian Union (155 points), and Cocktail Society (125 points) have all recently achieved Bronze accreditation
