Disabled Students Network Incorrect Terminology policy was presented by Secretary CW.

CW used the Chat function to present the policy. Those in attendance had the opportunity to read through the policy beforehand and in the council. CW explained that the Policy is about giving the staff and students some education about the right terminology used when talking about and with disabled students and raising awareness about disability and the effects it has on daily life. The reason the policy is being presented is because CW has been subject to some unjust comments from staff and many individuals across his life. CW feels that if people knew more about him and the right terminology to use, they wouldn't say certain things. CW hopes that the work that comes from the policy will provide some education and awareness to those people. CW would like to see a resource like a booklet for example that students could look at as a guide of what terminology is accepted and what is not, this could be worked on with the Dyslexia Disability Service (DDS)

Discussion about how members of the council like the idea and think it's good to have an accessible booklet available to address this issue. The Policy did not have a seconding Student so LGBTQ+ Students Network put themselves forward to second the policy.

LGBTQ+ Students' Network presented their Email Name Change Policy with the council. Members had the opportunity to read the policy beforehand and in the council. The Network shared that currently students can change their name on Blackboard and SOLE but their email address does not reflect this change. This causes issues when students email lecturers, but they don't use the students' preferred name even if they sign off with their preferred name. The effects this then has some students' experiences are a negative one, due to a name being connected with traumatic experiences that students' do not wish to relive. The Network are aware of students who have left university early because of this. The Network feel that change as a result of this policy would therefore increase mental well-being.

The LGBTQ+ Network also shared that the SU website also displays students' dead name and wondered if this too could be changed. AL shared that they have are aware of this issue and have lobbied the University on multiple occasions as this is something they are passionate about, but it being written as a policy by current students acts as further evidence for a need to change. AL discussed that feedback from the University seems changing names on emails is logistically possible, but

there is pushback from university. Students are able to change their name when they first come into university, but it becomes harder the further along in your university journey because names need to match documents for exams and legal purposes when they transfer over. ## Updating items

#### 19. **President Update**

AL updated on the Community Cupboard. The Cupboard has had 850 items donated to it. There have been reports to the University to show them that support is needed in terms of cost of living support. The Officers have been calling for donations as donations have for the cupboard have slowed down recently.

Next week is Network Week and the LGBTQ+ Students' Network are holding a coffee morning on Friday at Sugar Daddies and the International Students Network are holding a get together on Friday

Discussion: member said that it was good from a sustainability point of view we are recycling the vapes, but do we think it could be worth looking at the impact of vapes of on students' health and are the bins potentially encourage vaping habits? Discussed that the presence of the bins could be used as an opportunity to promote and talk about the health aspects of vaping. AL stated that talking about quitting smoking and vaping is not work we do as an SU but is something that can be incorporated with the introduction of the bins.

#### 20. **Network Update**

LGBTQ+ Network updated saying they have been busy and quiet at the same time. They had their Valentines Ball on the 11<sup>th</sup> of February. They shared that it was more successful than they thought it would be. They raised money and people seemed to have a good time. They are still pushing their campaign "Don't Presume" and throughout LGBTQ+ History Month they have been keeping an active social media presence with features such as "Get to know committee". They are holding a Coffee Morning as part of Network Week, and they want to keep them going as a regular thing.

International Students' Network updated with sharing their first event of the semester which was a mini walking tour of Worcester. They engaged two new students who hadn't engaged with the Network before. The purpose of the event was to show students the best spots, but they also got to listen to the international student experience from those that showed up.

### 21. **SU EDI group update**





Updated on the last SU EDI Group. Spoke about how the group continue to look at the cultural calendar and see what dates are relevant. Update regarding the anti-racist statement. This statement is now on our website and is available for students to read. Briefly updated on demographic data in SU services, that generally we can be doing better in terms of LGBTQ+, Mature and disabled students demographic in student groups and across our services. Those from lower socio-economic backgrounds participate less in societies and sports clubs.

### 22. GISU and Sustainability Committee

Updated on Sustainability summit. ASB attended the Sustainability Summit in Lincoln. Found it very insightful and learnt some good lessons. Key messages that were taken from the day were Decolonisation - not being afraid to question why we do things and questioning dominant knowledge in history.

Updated that the Sustainability Committee has met twice, and we are constantly reviewing our internal practices so the SU is sustainable.

#### 23. **Network Week**

AL explained the purpose of Network week as week where the SU will be going out and speaking to students regarding what they want to see from the Networks, barriers to joining networks, how you would improve the experience. Throughout the week we want students' honest feedback. AL updated that the artwork for the week went out this morning and shared that there were events happening from two of the Networks on Friday. Next week a video will be released by AL of what the Networks are.

OH asked whether they can have a presence on the stalls during the week, to which AL said that all Networks are more than welcome to come along and this could be really good promotion for them but they wouldn't be expected to run the stall on their own.
