6. **President Update**

AL provided a verbal update on their objectives and what they are working on currently.

AL updated on the following items:

- Go Green Week



- Accommodation & Housing issues working with Help & Advice Team to deal with a range of student house issues that have been coming to the attention of the union
- International Hardship Fund
- Network Events DSN Wheelchair basketball which was great fun and AL really enjoyed it and Race Equality Week which had lots of activities to get involved with
- Upcoming Leadership Elections

AL asked if there were any questions. There were no questions received.

7. Network/Society Updates

- Women's Network Planning to host a coffee morning in the city as well as doing a quiz takeover in the Hangar for International Womens month as well as bake sales, tea and coffee stands etc.
- Disabled Student Network Hoping to host the Basketball event in the Summer and hoping for more engagement as well as recently challenging the SU to take part in a campaign called a little less conversation, more action please!
- There were no updates from the ACS society.

8. **SU EDI Update**

AL updated that there had not been an SU EDI committee since the last meeting but there was one soon. AL also explained that there was an upcoming University EDI forum and asked whether the networks had been invited with HL confirming they had been.

9. **Sustainability**

AL explained that it was currently Go Green week and that there were lots of things going on in the Hangar such as pop ups, free activities, therapy dogs etc.

AL explained that the Union is currently working hard towards the Responsible Futures Manifesto which needs renewing every two years and this is the year we have to do it again.



Discussion Items

10. SU Leadership Elections

ARE started by introducing herself and explained her role as Director of Representation and Membership services. ARE provided the council with information about the upcoming leadership elections. ARE explained that nominations had opened and a explained a bit about each role highlighting the key remit of each position:

- President
- Vice President Education
- Vice President Student Activities

ARE explained how much fun being an officer is and how there is an opportunity to make the role your own and work on areas you are passionate about.

ARE talked through the dates for elections such as nominations and the voting period which are:

Nominations: Open now and closes on February 19th

Voting Period: 27th February to 29th

ARE talked through the wellbeing events and strategies that have been implemented into elections for 2024:

- Wellbeing morning for candidates after voting closes.
- Campaigning week being shortened to help with candidates' tiredness and mental wellbeing.
- Candidate breakfasts
- Wellbeing space in the SU for candidates to take a break.

ARE also discussed the rules that apply to networks and how they can engage with candidates to support engagement with their network and introduce a wider group of students to their network. The rules explained by ARE are as follows:

In the interest of fairness, networks, societies, and sports clubs must agree with their committee to do either one of the following: a. (i) allow NO candidates to post in their social media pages, attend their virtual meetings/events or sessions. b. (ii) allow ALL candidates to post





in their social media pages, attend their virtual meetings/events or sessions.

Action: ARE to circulate campaign rules to sub councils

11. NUS Liberation Conference

AL provided an update on the plan for NUS Liberation conference this year. AL explained that we can send delegates as VOTE ONLY delegates online this year. AL confirmed we will bring everything to council for a collective vote and AL would vote on the student's behalf as lead delegate.

*Following the conclusion of this meeting, NUS confirmed we can send 6 delegates as VOTE ONLY delegates to this conference, so councillors will be emailed with the opportunity to put themselves forward to take one of these roles.

12. Gen A.I Workshop

Helen Hope delivered a workshop on Gen A.I including what it is, how not to use A.I when doing university assignments/assessments and how to use A.I effectively.

13. **AOB**

HL explained that members had been expressing some difficulties in finding appropriate study spaces as many are too loud. HL also said that their members were not able to book the small rooms in the Hive and many of the Hive levels were too noisy.

Action: AL to reach out to the hive about booking rooms.

What Students Think manifesto

ARE explained to councillors what the 'What Students Think' manifesto was and how it might be something that would be interesting for networks to discuss and share with their members. AL explained that some of the statistics are hard hitting and might be a little upsetting for some students.

TeamWorc awards





AL explained that we are reviewing the TeamWorc awards as they can seem a bit focussed on sports and societies and not Networks and Academic reps. Al stated that ML would ask for some feedback via email.
