	7.1 "Free Book" or "Book Swap" bookshelf
	 THB outlined the Book Swap bookshelf idea and suggested that this could be placed in the SU building. HS notes that the Hive also does a Book Swap service and MP suggested that they could help support the SU with this. Executive Committee also discussed the issue around making the bookshelf Covid secure.
	7.2 Mobile signal boosters for halls
	- THB outlined the idea regarding better mobile signal for halls and noted that the idea currently has 2 votes.
	7.3 Reduction of single use plastic in campus shops/vending machines
	- THB outlined the idea regarding the reduction of single use plastic in campus shops and vending machines and noted this idea currently has 12 votes. THB notes that this idea if passed will fit in well with the SU's current approach to sustainability.



7.4 Preferred names and pronouns

- THB noted that a passed policy for preferred names and pronouns already exists and Executive committee should communicate this to the student who posted the idea and remove it. THB suggested that there should be more clarity on the process when there are already existing policies related to an idea. HS suggested in the case of an existing policy, the SU should communicate this to the student who submitted the policy for them to support it, and TM and MP both agreed with this position.

Action 07: THB to strengthen the Bye Laws in relation to ideas that have already been passed as policies.

7.5 Train Departure Boards on Campus

- THB outlined the idea regarding train departure boards on campus. RC noted that are already screens by main reception where you can access train times. Executive Committee discussed whether there are options to make the information for train times more visible to students.

8.1 Sunflower Lanyards

HS updated the Executive Committee:

- As in the Matters Arising (Item 6), HS has attempted to organise a meeting with the student who put forward the idea and is still awaiting a response.

8.2 Rainbow Crossing

HS updated the Executive Committee:

- As in the Matters Arising (Item 2), MP has posted the update about the postponement of the crossing on the idea's forum.

8.3 Recycling programme for hard to recycle waste

MP updated the Executive Committee:

- The policy has been brought to the attention of Katy Boom and will be developed further in the following weeks.

8.4 Dance Mats in the SU

TM updated the Executive Committee:



- On pause during lockdown, will continue once The Hangar has been reopened following the ease of national restrictions.

TM also updated the Executive Committee on the student medic programme:

- TM spoke with Kay Mohanna (Professor, School of Allied Health and Community) who suggested the student may want to progress the idea with the paramedic science team instead as the medical school as the Medical School is not yet operational.
- THB noted that an update should be posted on the idea's forum that due to the situation the implementation of a student medic programme will be challenging but that with the creation of the St John Ambulance Society it could be argued that some of what the student wanted was now being delivered.
- HS noted it could be worth having a continuous conversation regarding the student medic programme as the medical school is being set up.
- MP also raised that Katy Boom (Director of Sustainability) worked with British Heart Foundation in Go Green Week around free emergency first aid however there is a lack of student participation in this area.

8.5 More diverse food range

MP updated the Executive Committee:

- As in Matters Arising (Item 9), MP has reached out to Chartwell's and a representative has attended a meeting with Network chairs and MP has also provided them with feedback for improvement from the Networks.

9. **Campaign Updates**

TM updated on the Consent Campaign:

- TM met with the Women's Network and discussed the potential of a consent week for next year. This will involve panel discussions, a sex quiz in the Hangar and other activities.
- In the process of booking in a bystander training, as well as incorporating this in Sports Clubs, Societies and Networks committee training.
- SW asked the committee whether there have been students who have reached out to the SU following the recent gender-based violence and asked whether the Women's Network have been responding to the issue. MP noted that she has shared information with them regarding 'Call my App' and that the Network has been sharing relevant content on their social media.
- THB reminded Executive Committee that there is still a live policy on the Night Bus and they should continue to raise this if the university has discussions around safety. MP also noted that the SU should communicate other methods of safety for students if the Night Bus is unable to happen.

HS updated on the Rep Campaign:

- Videos of reps will be coming out soon to raise awareness around the academic representation system to promote for next year.



HS updated on the Academic Integrity Campaign:

- Set to launch on the 19th of April.
- Has spoken to marketing about how they can incorporate Nottingham's campaign digital marketing into Worcester branding.
- The Guardian, Telegraph and Turn It In will be covering the campaign.

HS updated on an upcoming Employability Campaign.

- HS will be meeting with marketing to discuss the campaign.
- HS liaised with Rose Watson and Robin Walker for support on the campaign.

THB updated Executive Committee that the SU received an email from an MP's assistant regarding an advice case. THB suggested that MP should get in touch with the MP to update Robin Walker's work around rent.

Discussion and Information Items

10. University Engagement Strategy

MP raised the action brought to Executive Committee from the Trustee Board about how the SU should look at engaging the university moving forwards given the changes in personnel.

MP raised the idea of a structured approach to how the new officers will engage with university staff. THB noted that this could be a discussion around officer induction and use induction to reset relationships and have regular catch ups. Executive Committee agreed to have a separate meeting around officer induction and transition.

11. Engagement in Elections/Engagement of Health based professional courses

MP raises the issue of how Executive Committee should reflect on engagement during elections, particularly around health based professional courses and how the engagement strategy moving forwards aligns with the university's approach.

THB noted that there were specific barriers that stopped engagement from students in health courses this year, such as being on placement during a pandemic. MP asked whether there should be student consultation done now to inform work in engagement over the summer. THB agreed, stating that there should be a plan for engagement in elections that involves thinking about engagement from September and throughout the year. HS noted that they should also look at engagement success and highlighted that if paramedics are more engaged in comparison to nursing students, to then think about why that is, as the barriers students on these courses face are similar.

SW suggested creating a Vocational Course Network. HS raised the issue that this may take away from the students' individual needs. MP suggested first figuring out why students from less engaged courses are less engaged and working with them to see what they need from the SU. THB stated that other approaches should also be considered in the possibility



that there is a lack of student feedback. MP further suggested to make progress to engage students from these courses through other avenues, such as being a mature student.

Action 09: SW and THB to develop an action plan in liaison with the relevant Schools to increase engagement with the SU from health based professional courses.
