6.1 Archery

After a brief discussion, it was pointed out that the minimum annual member charge was not included in the constitution or application format template clear.

7.1 Dance Mats in the SU



TM gave an overview of the idea. There was a discussion around the cost and location of the Dance Mat, how much students would be willing to pay to use it. TM noted there are potential plans to buy a PS4 for the Hangar, plug-in Dance Mat into the PlayStation as an alternative.

7.2 Black Lives Matter

Executive Committee discussed the policy and noted that the policy had taken nearly three months to get to the 25 votes needed for it to be considered. As a result a number of the elements identified in the idea had been implemented or superseded. Executive Committee felt that rather than passing these ideas it would be better to discuss with the student which ideas were still relevant and then agree with them what should be progressed.

Action 07: MP to discuss the Black Lives Matter idea with the student who submitted the idea and progress idea before next Executive Committee meeting.

7.3 Recycling Programme

Executive Committee discussed the idea and noted that they all thought it was something the Union should move forward with. MP noted that the Sustainability Network could collaborate on this project with the University's Sustainability department.

Vote to pass Recycling Programme idea.

8.1 Sunflower Lanyards

HS updated Executive Committee:

- HS spoke to RR regarding sunflower lanyards.
- If ordering more than 2 lanyards from the company, the SU is required to register and to undertake the training the organisation provides.

TM noted she had an email from student saying the Sunflower Lanyard scheme may make certain individuals with learning disability uncomfortable to wear them. Another option would be to use University specific lanyards. The committee noted that some exempt students feel they have to wear it otherwise they get called out for not wearing a mask. It was also noted that students have been mistakenly sent to the SU to get sunflower lanyards.

- TM and MP have kept in contact with Lucy Sandwell in Student Services

TM updated on the Body Image campaign, noting that the videographer for Akuma is going to get involved along with the Women's Network.

HS updated on the Academic Integrity and Essay Mills campaign, noting that he is meeting with NUS soon to move forwards.

TM updated on the Movember campaign, noting that several sports clubs are taking part marketing on men's – 4 sperate videos on men's mental health throughout November.

There was a brief discussion of some of the key points of feedback from the Covid-19 discussion at Student Council on 15.10.2020, including:

- Student unable to enter buildings such as Pierson and Jenny Lind due to issues with their student cards

- Thoughts on fees and value for money
- International students' experiences.

The Christmas census will be conducted by the University earlier than normal, so that they know how many students will be staying on campus
